Just Like Me Roger Ellis, Lead Pastor John 1:35-42, p. 740 Luke 5:1-11, p. 718

Of all the real life characters recorded in the Bible, there is one character with whom each of us identify. This character is seen on the pages of all four Gospels and the Book of Acts as one who is used mightily by God, but also as one who stumbles and struggles as a follower of Jesus—just like me. As a Christ follower I need to realize that:

Jesus has <u>chosen me</u> to follow Him.

Jesus will ask me to obey even when <u>I don't understand</u> (Luke 5:5).

3. I am **unqualified** to be a follower of Jesus (Luke 5:8).

4. Following Jesus is "from now on" (Luke 5:10).

THEONE THING: "From now on"

- O Memorize John 15:16.
- O What is Jesus asking you to do?
- O Identify what sidetracks you from following Jesus.
- O Get baptized next Sunday!

- 4 It's easy to look at Peter and forget his brother Andrew. What is the simple admiring trait about Andrew? Does Jesus want the same trait in you?

 - b. John 6:8-9
 - c. John 12:20-22
